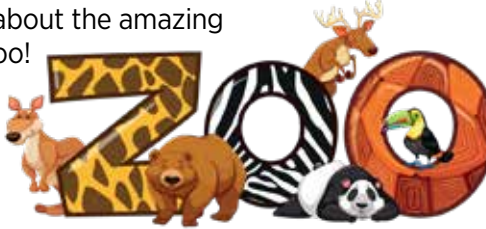

Week 1: July 9, 10, 11
Ages: 7-12 years old

WILD THINGS

Wild Watercolors

July 9, 10, 11 | Time: 10:00 am to noon | Class fee: \$60
Students will create paintings and drawings about their favorite animals using a variety of materials including watercolor, oil pastels, and acrylic paints.

Clay Animals

July 9, 10, 11 | Time: 10:00 am to noon | Class fee: \$60
Create your favorite animal out of clay! Learn the basics of clay while creating animal plaques to hang on the wall as well as small figurines.

Paper Maché Animals

July 9, 10, 11 | Time: 1 pm to 3 pm | Class fee: \$60
Using plaster-gauze strips, recycled materials and paint, students will sculpt and create their very own Wild Thing! Bright colors and animal patterns will be studied and used to adorn their creature.

Animal Prints

July 9, 10, 11
Time: 1 pm to 3 pm

Learn about the art form of printmaking and how to create multiple, colorful images using ink, brayers (rollers), 'plates' and paper. Animals will be our inspiration as we create several prints each day.

Food Art

July 16, 17, 18 | Time: 10 am to noon | Class fee: \$60
Yes - you can play with your food! In this class you will create art with fruits and vegetables! Students will learn about the Renaissance era artist Archimbaldo as well as modern dessert chefs that artfully sculpt tasty treats.



Paint Like VanGogh

July 16, 17, 18
Time: 10 am to noon
Class fee: \$60
Famous Impressionist artist Vincent Van Gogh will be our artist of inspiration for the week as we learn to paint and draw landscapes, flowers, and night time skies..."Van Gogh style"!

Clay International

July 16, 17, 18 | Time: 1 pm to 3 pm | Class fee: \$60
Come along on our imaginary journey around the world as we look for interesting pottery styles from different cultures. Learning basic hand-building techniques, students will create with air-dry and kiln fired clay.

Jewelry World Tour

July 16, 17, 18 | Time: 1 pm to 3 pm | Class fee: \$60
Beads, "Swiftie" bracelets, friendship braiding and more will fill our week of learning how to make jewelry for our imaginary world tour. Students will work with a variety of materials to make jewelry, pins, necklaces and more.

Week 3: July 23, 24, 25
Ages: 7-12 years old

Creative Magic

Magic Image Transfer

July 23, 24, 25 | Time: 10 am to noon | Class fee: \$60
Students will be provided with a variety of pre-printed images that can be magically transferred onto the surface of wet clay. Cups, bowls, and wall plaques will be created while learning the basics of building with fired and air-dry clay.



Magical Painting and Drawing

July 23, 24, 25
Time: 10 am to noon
Class fee: \$60
Fairytale and Fantasies will inspire our creative paintings and drawings throughout the week. Students will work with watercolor, 'magic salt,' oil pastels and more to create unique works of art.

Maker Space - Fantasy Land

July 23, 24, 25 | Time: 1 pm to 3 pm | Class fee: \$60
Do you like to build? This class will encourage student's creative freedom with a 'daily challenge.' Wood, hot glue, recycled materials and more will be available to construct structures and sculptures.

Creative Action Painting

July 23, 24, 25 | Time: 1 pm to 3 pm | Class fee: \$60
Use your wizard wand to make paint fly onto your canvas! Students will learn about famous artist Jackson Pollock and be inspired by his drip and splatter techniques. Students should wear old clothes and shoes and plan to spend part of the day outside painting, weather permitting.

CLAY CAMP

July 30, 31, August 1 | 10:30 am - 12:30 pm* | Class fee: \$60
Clay Camp is a unique pottery program offering a total hands-on experience in a variety of ceramic techniques, incorporating hand-building, throwing on the wheel, glazing and firing. Class size is limited and designed for individual instruction. No clay experience required; beginners welcome!

*The clay studio is open in the afternoon to enrolled students who wish to continue working independently.

(Tues, Wed, Thurs. noon-1:00 p.m) Students bring their own lunch and have fun creating a different art project each day. Weather permitting, activities could include walks in the sculpture park, daily craft projects, group mural, or a visit to the museum galleries and family center.
