Easter egg patterns will be provided as well as tools and a variety of different colors of glass for students to choose from. Students will gain experience learning to cut curves in glass. Everyone will create one glass egg that can be hung in a window and enjoyed this spring.

Tool kit available for beginning students \$75. Modified supply kits available for purchase from instructor as needed for more experienced students who may already have some tools. Advanced students will be guided on an individual basis focusing on more complex windows or lampshades.

Watercolor Flowers

Students will learn the basics of watercolor painting in this one evening workshop. Pictures of flowers will be provided, or you may bring your own. The instructor will demonstrate how to sketch the basic shape and form of the flower and then how to laver watercolor paints to add color and depth.











Obvara Firing Workshop

Part 1 - Sunday, June 8 Part 2 - Sunday, June 22

Class fee: \$75 | includes all materials and kiln firing

Obvara firing is a traditional pottery firing technique from Eastern Europe that involves dipping hot pottery into a yeast mixture and then into water. The process creates unique surface patterns and colors on the pottery. On the first day of the workshop (June 8) students will create a pot in wet clay. The instructor will demonstrate hand-building methods, or students with experience may choose to use the potter's wheel. The second day of the workshop (June 22) the class will fire their work in the outdoor kiln at Shrode Art Center and dip the hot pots into the Obvara mixture. Finished pots will be cool and ready to take home that day.

Bring and enjoy your favorite beverage while you learn the magic of clay. This one afternoon class is a great way for beginners (having never touched clay) to learn the basics of clay and explore a variety of different ways to hand-build a coffee cup. Students will learn how to make different styles of handles and attach to the side of their cup. All cups will be created from a stoneware clay body, which means they are food safe, microwave, and dishwasher safe and ready for everyday use. Finished pieces will be fired in the kiln and ready to pick-up in two weeks.

Bring your favorite beverage to sip while you learn the magic of clay. This one afternoon class



is a great way for beginners (having never touched clay) to learn the basics of clay and explore a variety of different ways to draw and paint on pre-made 6" clay tiles. Students will learn how to use underglaze pencils to draw their design. Stencils will be provided, or students may create their own design. Underglaze paints will be used to add color. Finished pieces will be fired in the kiln and ready to pickup in two weeks.



Raku Clay Workshop

Class fee: \$75 | includes cost of clay, glazes, and kiln firing

Raku is an exciting, action-packed outdoor firing experience! This is a great opportunity to learn the basics of working with clay and witness the magic of an ancient art form. Thurs., May 15 instructor Judy Mason will teach students how to create a clay pot using hand-building methods (more experienced clay artists will be guided independently on projects of their choosing.) Thurs., May 29 students will learn how to glaze and decorate their pot and prepare for the firing on Sat., May 31. When the outdoor kiln is 'peaking,' at over 1800 degrees, the molten red pieces are grabbed out of the kiln with tongs and placed in nearby containers filled with combustible materials. The smoke and flames create metallic colors and deep, black charcoal effects on the surface of the pottery. After cooling, the surfaces are cleaned to reveal the magic of the glazes and will be ready to take home late Saturday afternoon.

Horse Hair Pottery

Learn the amazing technique of horse hair pottery and the unpredictable magic these rich, black lines can bring to your pots!



The first day of class will focus on hand building bulbous vessels, similar to Native American Pueblo Pottery. Students will learn how to smooth and burnish the outer surface of the pot with a pebble or spoon. The second class will be spent firing the pottery and applying pieces of horse hair, to the hot surface of the pot, creating smoky, organic lines. Students will learn how to finish and seal their work by buffing the outer surface with wax. Pots will be ready to take home that afternoon.



Throwing on the Potter's Wheel

Tuesdays April 8, 15, 22

Time: 6:00 pm to 9:00 pm Instructor: Chandler Hemby

Class fee: \$75 | includes all materials and kiln firing

This class is a great way for beginners, having never tried the wheel, to learn the basics of how to throw. Each night the instructor will begin class by demonstrating how to throw simple forms, e.g., cylinder, bowl, vase. Students will be guided as they practice throwing multiple balls of clay each night. Shrode Art Center has 5 electric potter's wheels. The class size is limited to ensure everyone has a wheel and work station. Finished pieces will be fired in the kiln and ready for pick-up two weeks after class.

Private Art Parties are available for special events, all ages. You may choose between throwing on the wheel or hand-building projects.





Introduction to Weaving

Class Fee: \$125 | includes all materials

Have fun learning the joy of weaving! During the first-class students will work on a prewarped, table-top loom, ready to start weaving. All fiber will be provided and is included in the class fee. At the end of the first class, students will complete a long, rectangular garment, that could be worn as a cowl/scarf or laid flat to be a decorative table runner. The second-class, students will learn how to warp the loom and start a project from the very beginning. The last class will be focused on finishing your second project on the loom. No experience required, beginners and all skill levels welcome. *Returning students from the Fall 2024 class can be guided on a different pattern: Houndstooth, which requires two shuttles and requires some experience.

Come explore how to write poetry and create a work of art inspired by your poem. A focus on 'Concrete Poetry' will be practiced where a poem is written in the outline shape of the subject e.g., a tree, bunny, bird,



house, etc. Students will be encouraged to write their own poems after practicing a few writing exercises. But, patterns and poems will be provided for use as well. The workshop is not limited to just concrete poetry, all creative writing options and freedom will be encouraged. After we practice the writing component led by Alicia, Carrie will demonstrate how to draw and blend oil pastels to create a background or foundation to your artwork. Then watercolor will be applied on top, playing with the fun of 'oil and water don't mix' as the paint pools and puddles around the pastels. We will combine the two art forms and experiment with different ways to incorporate our poems/words into a work of art. This class is open to middle schoolers through adults.



Private art lessons are offered at Shrode Art Center for those who prefer working one-on-one and to help accommodate your busy schedule. Lessons can be tailored to your specific area of interest and allow a beginner or more advanced artist to develop the skills and techniques they want to hone and perfect. Please be considerate of art center staff and your instructor and be on time.

NEW! – Crochet

Learn the basics of how to crochet a small trivet. Multiple lessons are encouraged to be able to move on to more challenging patterns like scarfs, hats, etc.

Chair Caning

Learn the traditional, 9 step, chaircaning technique that can be used in a variety of ways. If you have an old chair or stool you need to re-cane the instructor will teach you how to repair your old furniture. An additional material fee will be paid to instructor based on the size of project and how much reed is used.

Drawing and Painting

All media and themes are available: watercolor, acrylic, pencil, pen and ink, etc. Nature, Comic Book Drawing, Paint Pour, Portraiture, etc.
