Week 1: July 8, 9, 10

Ages: 7-12 years old

Painting - Ocean Sparkle

July 8, 9, 10 | Time: 10 am to noon | Class fee: \$60

Students will create paintings and drawings inspired by the ocean, seascapes, and sea life using a variety of materials including oil pastels, glitter, and metallic paints.

Clay Critters

July 8, 9, 10

Time: 10 am to noon

Class fee: \$60

Create your favorite animal or critter out of clay! Learn the basics of clay while creating animal plaques to hang on the wall as well as animal bowls and small figurines.



Paper Maché - Oaxacan Animals

July 8, 9, 10 | Time: 1 pm to 3 pm | Class fee: \$60

Using plaster-gauze strips, recycled materials and paint, students will sculpt and create their very own Oaxacan Animal! Bright colors and patterns will be studied and used to paint their finished creature.



Colorful Mosaics

Students will learn about different kinds of mosaics from around the world. Then, create their own using mixed media, metallic papers, and air-dry clay

Week 2: July 15, 16, 17

Ages: 7-12 years old

Fiber Arts

July 15, 16, 17 | Time: 10 am to noon | Class fee: \$60

Discover the joy of Fiber Arts! Students will explore the basics of weaving, "free style needle work," fabric collages and more.

Optical Art

July 15, 16, 17

Time: 10 am to noon

Class fee: \$60

This class will explore how to create optical illusions in your drawings using pencil, pen & ink, and markers. Learn about artist M. C. Escher and how to bring geometric shapes and patterns to life.



Beads & Bling Jewelry

July 15, 16, 17 | Time: 1 pm to 3 pm | Class fee: \$60

Beads, bracelets, friendship braiding and more will fill our week learning how to make jewelry for everyday use. Students will work with a variety of materials to make pins, necklaces, jewelry boxes and more.

Clay - What's for Dinner?

Have fun creating clay cups, bowls, and plates you can use at dinner time! We will work with a stoneware clay body that is food safe, dishwasher and microwave safe for everyday use.



Impressionist Painting

July 22, 23, 24 | Time: 10 am to noon | Class fee: \$60

Students will learn about the Impressionist Art Movement and create a variety of landscapes and paintings like Monet, Renoir, and Degas!

Maker Space - Build, Explore, Create!

Do you like to build? This class will encourage student's creative freedom with a 'daily challenge.' Wood, hot glue, recycled materials and more will be available to construct structures and sculptures.
